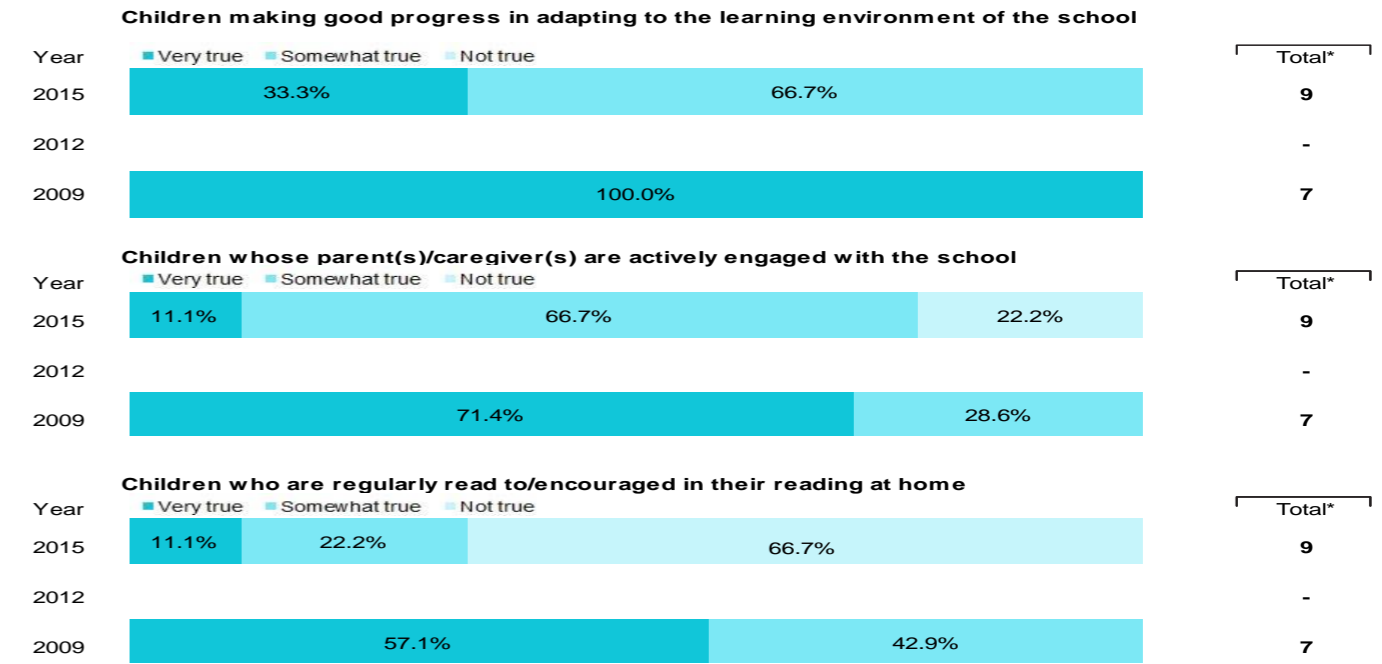


Australian Early Development Census (AEDC)

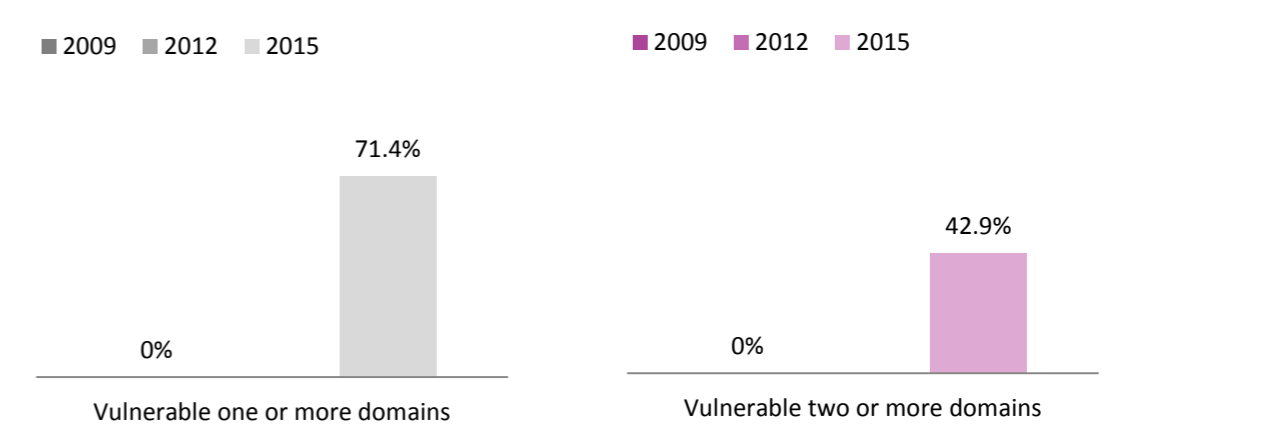
The AEDC is a nationwide survey that shows how young Australian children have developed as they start their first year of formal full-time education and aims to inform the types of services, resources and support that young children and their families need. AEDC Domain results

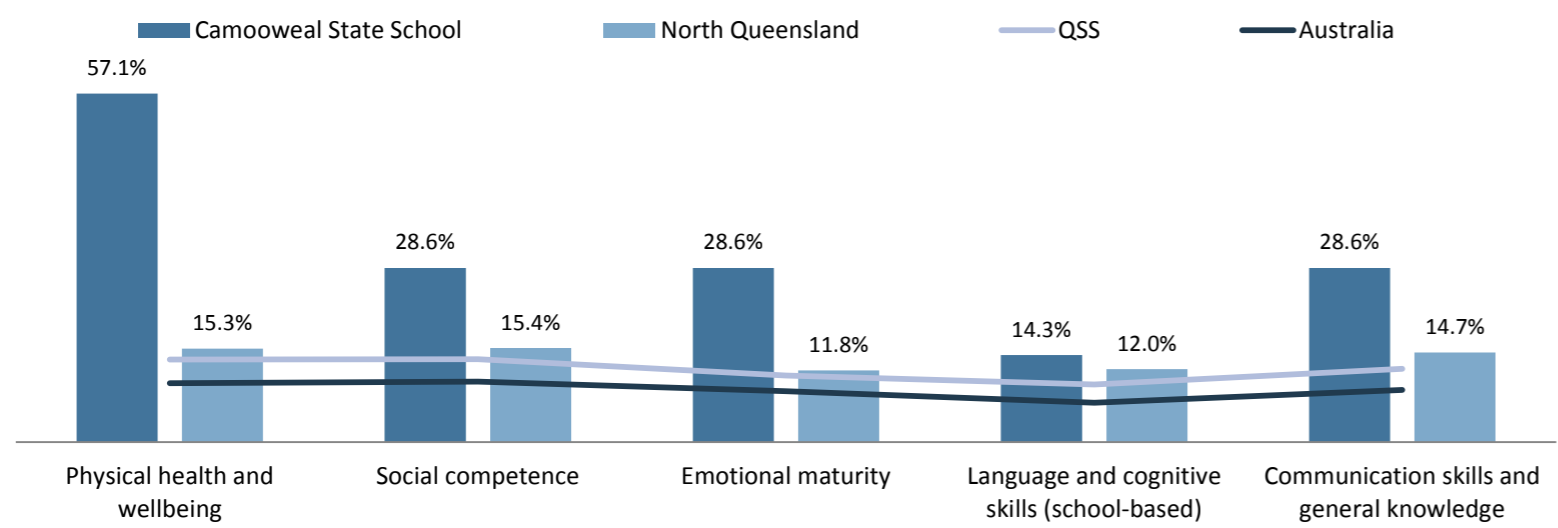
The Early Development Instrument measures five important areas of early childhood development. These five areas – also called domains – are closely linked to the child’s health, education and social outcomes as they grow into their adulthood.
